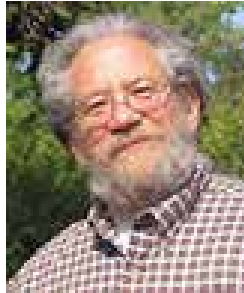


# Visiting Author Joel Greenberg
