

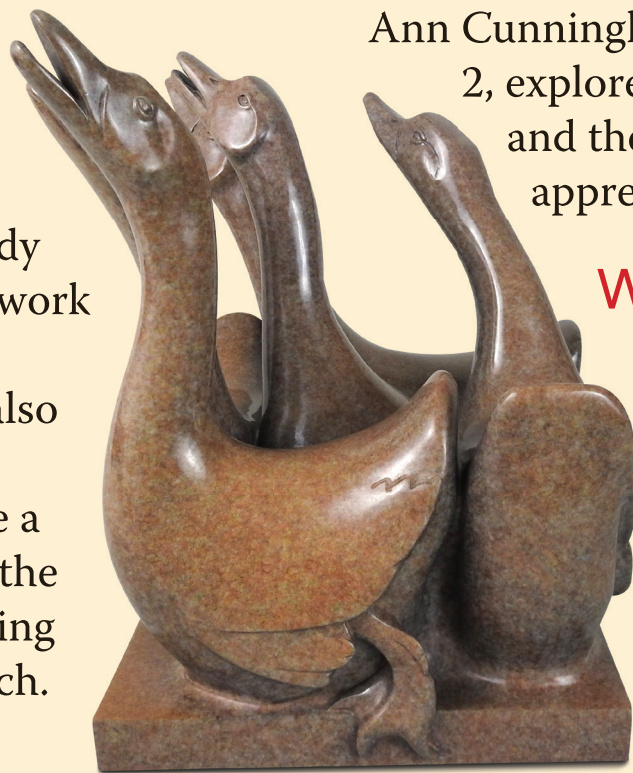
In Touch with Art

Tactile Sculpture



The Woodson Art Museum's inaugural tactile art exhibition debuts with five avian sculptures, available on a "touch table" in the Decorative Arts Gallery. This touchable artwork installation – the first in an ongoing series – provides ready access to original artwork for visitors with low vision or blindness, also encouraging sighted visitors to experience a new way to "see" via the mind's eye – visualizing artwork through touch.

A commitment to providing accessible and compelling art experiences for all inspired the tactile art exhibition with guidance from tactile sculptor Ann Cunningham. Beginning March 2, explore touchable sculpture and the power of hands-on art appreciation.
