

44TH Annual Student Art Exhibition

March 13 – April 25, 2021

Scope

This exhibition is open to art specialists teaching in public, parochial, and home schools in Central Wisconsin. Its purpose is to recognize and display the original and creative classroom artwork done by students in grades 5-8.

Recognition

Each student will receive a Certificate of Merit that signifies having an artwork displayed in the Student Art Exhibition at the Woodson Art Museum.

Rules of Entry

1. Quantity

Each teacher, regardless of the number of classes taught, may enter a combined maximum of four two- and three-dimensional artworks. No exceptions.

2. Originality

Each artwork entered must be an original design. Artworks produced from pre-designed kits should not be entered. If the artwork is the result of an assignment using pre-existing materials (such as photographs or printed materials), an explanation of the project must be noted on the Entry Tag and on the Master List. (See 3A and 3B)

3. Display

- A. Each artwork must have a complete and legible Entry Tag attached. Tags for three-dimensional artworks may be taped to the object or placed inside.
- B. Teachers must complete the Master List provided by the Museum and include the addresses for those students whose works are submitted so notification can be mailed to the students and their families.
- C. All two-dimensional artwork must be mounted. Frames are not encouraged. Matted artwork must be secured to sturdy backing boards, such as corrugated cardboard or matboard. Tagboard, posterboard, and glass are not acceptable.

D. Each wall-mounted artwork must have a hanging device securely attached, such as a plastic hanger (which can be purchased at the Museum), sawtooth, or screw eyes and wire. White paper adhesive hangers are not acceptable.

E. Two-dimensional artwork cannot exceed 36 inches. Three-dimensional artwork cannot exceed 34 inches and 25 pounds.

F. Artwork will not be insured by the Museum while on exhibition or while in transit to and from the Museum.

4. Delivery

- A. Artwork must be received at the Woodson Art Museum between February 19 – 23, 2021, during designated hours.
- B. All artwork must be delivered by the art specialists unless other arrangements are made with Student Art Exhibition coordinator Jane Weinke: call 715-845-7010 or email jweinke@lywam.org.
- C. Artwork must be delivered to the Woodson Art Museum, 700 N. 12th Street, Wausau; artwork may be shipped prepaid by either UPS or US Mail. Please notify Jane Weinke if artwork will be shipped.

Note: Artwork that does not meet the above criteria will not be accepted.

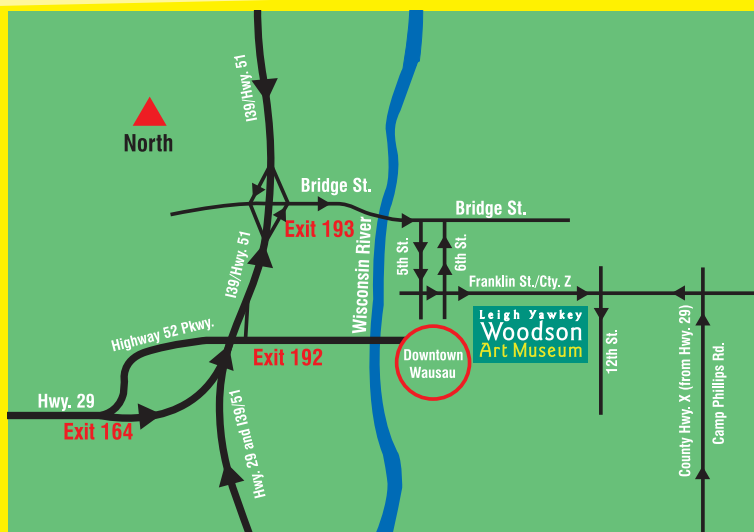
