Wausau's Artrageous Weekend™ Features Four Venues September 9-10, 2023

WAUSAU, WISCONSIN: The 34th annual <u>Wausau's Artrageous Weekend</u>, Saturday and Sunday, September 9-10, offers fun for all ages during north-central Wisconsin's biggest art extravaganza, spanning both sides of the Wisconsin River.

This weekend favorite overflows with art throughout four admission-free locations – Art in the Park in Marathon Park, the opening of "Birds in Art" at the Leigh Yawkey Woodson Art Museum, and the Festival of Arts and the Center for the Visual Arts galleries, both in downtown Wausau.

 <u>Art in the Park</u>, organized by the Wisconsin Valley Art Association, brings together more than 120 juried exhibitors in the East Gate Hall and Exhibition Building at Marathon Park on Stewart Avenue near 17th Avenue on Wausau's west side. Affordable art and hand-crafted items available for purchase include pottery, wearable art, paintings, photography, and more. A children's art and craft area will offer free activities. Food and beverages are available for purchase from local non-profit groups and businesses; ATM available. Free admission. Saturday, 9am–5pm; Sunday, 9am–4pm.

- Wausau Festival of Arts, first launched in 1965, is located on Third Street and the 400 Block in downtown Wausau. Attendees can purchase fine art by over 120 juried artists representing a variety of mediums. Strolling down Third Street, the festive browse-andbuy atmosphere is enhanced by live music on the 400 Block stage. Families can participate in children's art activities in the Family Art tent and enjoy family appropriate entertainment on the Family Stage, while adults can indulge their creativity by taking "Still Young at Art" classes in the upper classroom of the Center for Visual Arts. At the Young Collector Market and Scholarship Silent Auction, art collectors of all ages can purchase art generously donated by Festival artists with the proceeds providing scholarships for area high school Seniors who are planning on pursuing an art related field in college. Food stands, operated by local non-profit organizations, offer assorted foods and beverages. Free admission. Saturday, September 9, 10 a.m.-5 p.m.; Sunday, September 10, 10 a.m.-4 p.m.
- <u>Center for the Visual Arts</u>, 427 N. Fourth Street, is a 501-(c)3 not-for-profit visual arts organization working to engage people in the visual arts and add to the livability of the Wausau regional community. The CVA offers free, public exhibits in four professional gallery spaces, affordable art classes for children and adults, artwork made by local artists in the CVA Gift Shop, and free art projects to community events throughout the year. In addition, the organization partners with other local groups and businesses to enrich the local community. Visit during Wausau's Artrageous Weekend 2023 to experience 10+ artist demonstrations, including ceramics, digital art, painting, and more on Saturday, September 9, 10 a.m.-5 p.m.; Sunday, September 10, 10 a.m.-4 p.m.

• *Birds in Art* opening weekend at the Leigh Yawkey Woodson Art Museum Saturdaymorning festivities including an artist presentation, Artists in Action, and morning opportunities to meet dozens of artists who flock to the Museum from throughout the world for the opening of this 48th annual internationally renowned exhibition. Majestic yet fragile, birds connect us with the natural world. Heralding each sunrise and gathering at dusk, these harbingers of seasonal and environmental change endlessly fascinate and inspire. Browse galleries to see fresh artistic takes on birds via original paintings, sculptures, and graphics created with the past three years. Since 1976, the Leigh Yawkey Woodson Art Museum has organized *Birds in Art* annually, seeking to present the best contemporary artistic interpretations of avian themes. Always free admission. Special opening-weekend hours: Saturday, September 9, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.; Sunday, September 10,

Wausau's Artrageous Weekend, the collaborative promotion of four separate events, traditionally is held on the weekend after Labor Day. Events in 2020 were cancelled due to coronavirus concerns and resumed in 2021.

10 a.m.-5 p.m. *Birds in Art* is scheduled to remain on view through November 26, 2023.
