Their depiction in art continues to evolve, mirroring changes in cultural and artistic paradigms, and providing a rich vein for contemporary artistic inquiry.

This exhibition, selected by the Woodson Art Museum's curatorial team following its initial display there, represents a snapshot of the finest international and domestic wildlife artists working today. Throughout, artworks capture the varied expressions of the avian form and life. This showcase exhibition brings together a diverse collection of artworks, ranging from the two-dimensional including painting, printmaking, and drawing to the three-dimensional in mediums such as bronze and stone. Artworks range in style from the abstract to the hyperreal, further underscoring *Birds in Art* as a unique opportunity for a multimedia, multistylistic presentation.
